There will be a celebration on the Fourth of July at the Tenmile opera-house, in which all are invited to participate, and everything is free.

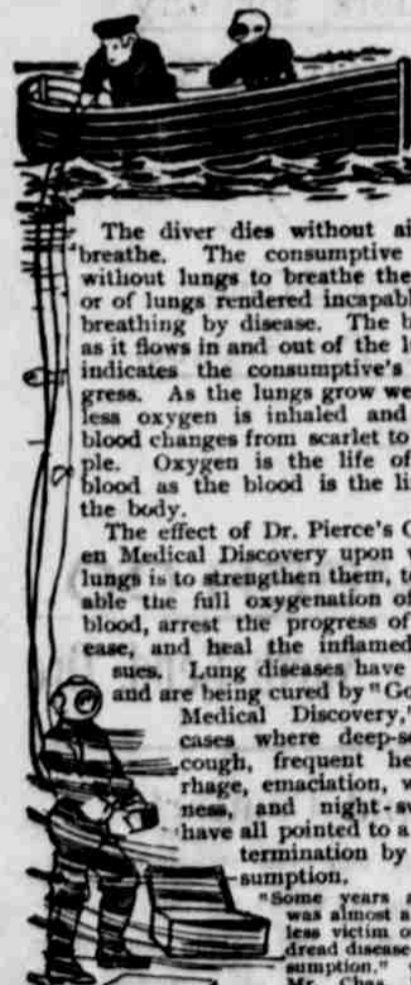
Chester Lawrence of May went to Tenmile Tuesday to put up a boiler and an engine for a cheese-plant on the Cushman estate.

**Chamberlain's Majority Cut Down**

**FURNISH DOES NOT CONCEDE HIS DEFEAT**

**Rest of Ticket and Legislature Republican—Direct Legislation Carries Safely**

Salem, June 4—The latest figure on governor in the election show that Chamberlain has carried the state by about 1000, with five bunch grass counties to hear from. These five counties gave Geer a plurality in 1898 of 530 votes, but it is not expected that Furnish will more than carry them even. The rest of the state ticket is elected by a large plurality.

Furnish does not yet concede that he is defeated. Chamberlain claims the election by 1000 to 1500 plurality. Both Republican congressmen are elected and legislature is Republican in both houses. The direct legislative amendment carried by a large majority.

**WRECK OF MISSING STEAMER FOUND**

Rangoon, India, June 4—The wreck of the missing steamer Camorta has been found, proving beyond doubt that sixty-five passengers and ninety of the crew were all lost. It is believed that the Camorta went down during the cyclone of May 6th.

Portland, June 4—The Republican state chairman says the returns so far give Furnish 73 majority outside of Multnomah with five counties yet to hear from. Multnomah gives Chamberlain probably 500 majority. The Democrats say the Republican figures are erroneous.

**STRIKE IS COMPLETE**

**MORE MEN JOIN THE IDLE MINERS**

**No Violence so Far—President Roosevelt Asked to Take a Hand**

Wilkesbarre, June 4—"Today I think I can say that our strike is practically complete," said President Mitchell this morning. "Additional firemen, engineers and pump men having joined on forces.

Local operators say the pumps were working and they have no fear of floods. They claim to have competent men to take the strikers places. Union men continue to arrive at various places, throughout the anthracite region, but thus far no violence has been attempted.

New York, June 4—President Roosevelt has been asked to stop the coal strike by business men of this city. Formal action was taken this afternoon at a meeting of the New York Board of Trade and Transportation. A set of resolutions were adopted urging the president to investigate the situation.
