A MATHEMATICAL PROBLEM

Can You Solve It or Prove That It Cannot Be Solved?

At a lecture at the Royal institution on the fascinating subject of "Magie Squares" Major P. A. MacMahon, F. R. S., reminded his audience of the existence of a curious problem which, despite its apparent simplicity, has never yet been solved. He commended it to the attention of any one present who desired to exercise his ingenuity and patience. The problem is as follows; There are thirty-six officers of six different ranks and drawn from six different regiments, and it is required to arrange them in a square of thirty-six compartments, so that in each row as well af in each column there appears an officer of each rank and also an officer from each regiment. Enter's "Recherches Sur une Nouvelle Espece de Quarres Magiques," which appeared in 1782, discusses this problem, but gives no solution, and the late Professor Cayley, writing more than a century afterward, confessed that it was beyond his powers. Major MacMahon, who has added so much to our knowledge of the theory of groups-a fascinating branch of mathematics which has an important bearing on many branches of physical science-has not yet found a key to the mystery. Whoever can solve this problem or prove that it cannot be solved will achieve immortality on the lips of mathematicians and perhaps open a door into a new realm of the scientific wonderland which is called pure mathematics .- London Post.
