Badger Republicans in Session

A FULL STATE TICKET
IS TO BE CHOSEN

Special Session of the Virginia Leg-
islature Called to Ratify
New Constitution.

Madison, Wis., July 15:—Delegates and politicians generally are flocking into Madison for what promises to be one of the liveliest state conventions the Badger State has witnessed in recent years. The Republican state convention to nominate candidates for governor and other state officers to be chosen this fall will be called to order at noon tomorrow by George E. Bryant, chairman of the state committee.

Though Governor La Follette will be able to control the convention so far as securing his own renomination the opposition of the "stalwarts" is considered of sufficient strength to make things lively. Unless all indications go astray there will be a lively time on the convention floor when resolutions are introduced indorsing John C. Spooner for re-election to the Senate. La Follette and his lieutenants make no effort to hide their intention to oppose this resolution with all the strength at their command. La Follette proposes to make a clean sweep of everything, and will not be afraid of being swept off the political map himself by any popular wave in the convention for Spooner. The La Follette people do not believe that La Follette can be beaten at any thing he undertakes in politics, and that if he starts out to hang the scalp of the popular Mr. Spooner to his belt he will do it, for the convention is his, they say, to do as he pleases, and he fought hard and long to get it. Besides the head of the ticket candidates will be named for lieutenant governor, secretary of state, treasurer, insurance commissioner, railroad commissioner, attorney general and superintendent of public instruction. For all the places on the ticket there are several aspirants in the field and all of them are busily engaged today conducting button-hole campaigns among the delegates who have arrived.

Lincoln, Neb., July 15:—William J. Bryan goes east this week and from all indications there is to be more politics than pleasure in the trip. He is to confer with Lewis Nixon, the deposed Tammany leader, and later will go to Boston to attend the annual banquet of the Democratic League of that city, which will be in the nature of a counter demonstration to the recent harmony feast of the Tilden Club of New York. While in Boston he will confer with George Fred Williams and other New England leaders of the Bryan wing of the Democratic party.

Richmond, Va., July 15:—In compliance with the requirements of Virginia's new state constitution the General Assembly convened in extra session today for the purpose of recognizing the instrument and adopting such supplementary legislation as is necessary. It is expect-

ed that the session will last at least two weeks and possibly three. Judges for 24 new circuits are to be elected, and some spirited contests are assured.

BITUMINOUS MINERS EXPECTED TO STRIKE

Indianapolis, July 15.—The delegates to the national convention of miners, called to consider the advisability of calling a strike of the bituminous miners, are beginning to arrive. President Mitchell was among this morning's arrivals. It is the general opinion that a strike will be ordered.

BLANKS ISSUED FOR INDIAN WAR VETS

Washington, July 15.—The pension office today issued a large number of blank forms upon which the Indian War Veterans may file their applications for pensions under the law recently passed. These supplies will be furnished to all who make request of the pension office. A large number have also been sent to representative Tongue for distribution. One set of blanks is issued for survivors, another for widows.
