CONVENTION ADOPTS MITCHELL'S PLAN

Assessments on Working Miners to Support Strikers—Operators will try to Operate

Indianapolis, July 19—The United Mine Workers Convention this afternoon adopted Mitchell's plan for carrying on the fight in the anthracite district. The plan was slightly modified by the committee, but in effect is about the same.

The plan provides for an assessment of 10 per cent on the earnings of members of districts 6, 8, 12, 13, 19 and 25. \$1.00 per week on members of districts 2, 5, 11, 14, 15, 16 and 20, an assessment of 25 per cent on all officers of the union. Assessments are to begin July 16.

Information has been received by the delegates to the national convention that the operators have decided to take the offensive without delay. Their purpose is said to be to start five breakers next week.

SILETZ RESERVATION OPENED FOR ENTRY

Twenty-Three Thousand Acres of the of the Best Land—Squatters on Nearly Every Claim.

Oregon City, July 19—What promises to be the greatest rush for land ever seen in the local United States Land Office will be witnessed Monday, when 23,000 acres of the best land in the Siletz Reservation, in Lincoln county, will be thrown open.

The land must be taken under the Homestead law.

The township is rated to contain the finest agricultural land in the whole reservation, and it is known that there will be 150 filings made.

No doubt practically the whole township will be taken. At present there are about 200 squatters on the 143 claims.

These people have three months preference right on the land after the date of entering.

SMITHS FRIENDS CRITICISE PRESIDENT

Discharged War Department Clerk Fighting for Right of Free Speech

Washington, July 21—The Army and Navy Journal in a semi-official article commenting on the Smith case says that the general's retirement, morally at least, if not technically, increases the punishment adjudged against him, and that it violates the spirit of the one hundred and twelfth article of war, and concludes: "We regard the President's action not only unjust, but unwise and unfortunate."

Rebecca Taylor, a war department clerk, dismissed for criticism of the President in print, has brought suit in a writ of mandamus, to compel Root to reinstate her. In the statement to the press she alleges that her object in bringing the suit is to defend the right of free speech.
