

BACKED BY SOLDIERS

Deputy Sheriffs Arrest Strikers

MEN FOUND WOUNDED
IN FEET AND LEGS

Hooting Mob Surrounds Justices Office--Eighth Regiment Has its Rest Disturbed

Shenandoah, Aug. 5--Backed by 100 soldiers two men, accused of being implicated in the Wednesday riot, were arrested by deputy sheriffs at noon today.

The soldiers surround the house in which the men were concealed and held back at the point of the bayonet the struggling, cursing mob, while the deputies carried out the men, two Lithuanians. Both men were found to be shot in the feet. Three more wounded miners are in the hospital at Willow Springs, shot in the legs and feet.

Huge crowds surrounded the justices' office, cursing and hooting the soldiers and a second company has been called.

The entire camp of the English regiment was aroused late last night by shots fired at prowlers by the sentries. Five minutes later the regiment stood ready for orders to move, but no renewed attacks occurred.

Cleveland, Aug. 5--Steamer Seguin, collided with and sank the freight Steamer City of Venice last night in lake Erie, 30 miles northwest of this city. Three of the crew of the Venice were drowned, and 13 were rescued.

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SOUTHERN OREGON DEAL SAID TO BE CLOSED

Major Kinney Tells the Oregonian of the Future City of Bangor

Sunday's Oregonian has this to say of the closing of the deal for the Southern Oregon Co.'s property:

The option which M. J. Kinney took a few weeks ago on a large block of property reaching inland from Coos Bay was taken up yesterday, and Mr. Kinney made his first payment. The property includes 97,000 acres of timber land and most of the platted town of Empire City, including the big saw mill that was built and operated for a time by Elijah Smith. It is owned by the Southern Oregon Company, of which Prosper Smith, brother of Elijah, is the head, his home being in Boston. No official announcement of the price to be paid has been made, but it is said to be the round figure of \$600,000. It is also said that this deal is favorable to the success of the Great Central Railroad.

Concerning the tract of land below town purchased by the Great Central Land Co. of C. H. Merchant and the Flanagan estate, the Oregonian says: Thirty-six men are now surveying and platting the tract, and as soon as arrangements can be made the town of Bangor will be laid off there and given legal existence. The Bank of Bangor will be organized this week and the first issue of the first paper of the new town will also appear this week. The company will soon begin construction of a cut-stone building to house the bank, a trust company and a title company. This structure will be a model that it is expected other buildings in the town will follow.

"Portland is the first town in Maine

and Bangor is second," said L. D. Kinney, chief engineer of the Great Central Railroad and the moving spirit in the allied enterprises. "We concede, of course, that Portland is the first city in Oregon, and we intend to make Bangor the second. The country is there to warrant it. All that is needed is development, and we expect to provide means for its development."

ORDERS HIS SOLDIERS TO SHOOT TO KILL

Camp Attacked by Strike Sympathizers--Double Guard Supplied With Ball Cartridges

Shenandoah Aug. 4--The entire Twelfth regiment was called to arms Saturday night as a result of three attacks of men in ambush, who assaulted the troops in camp outside of the city.

The attacks are becoming so frequent that Brigadier General Corbin has decided to adopt stern measures.

Last night a double guard supplied with ball cartridges, surrounded the camp, and the sentries have been instructed if stone throwing was repeated they must shoot to kill and investigate afterwards.

No renewal of the Saturday night attack on the soldiers' camp by the strikers' was made last night.

Two Lithuanians are under arrest in the guard house, and the troops have been supplied with ball cartridges.

The funeral of Joseph Beddell occurred this afternoon. In anticipation of trouble, a strong force was on hand.

Los Alamos, Cal., August 2--There had been no earthquake disturbances up to noon today. The only disturbance during the night was a slight shock at 3 a. m. The people are returning to their homes.

Shenandoah, August 2--The report that several collieries here and at Scranton are to be started Tuesday has a quieting effect.

The guards around the collieries were doubled this morning. No effort was made to send men in.

General Corbin, commander of the troops denied any knowledge of the operators' intention, but said if they desired to resume they would probably do so. If the sheriff cannot preserve order, his soldiers will.

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Washington, Aug. 2--Rowen cables this afternoon from Caracas, Venezuela, the following: The united revolutionary army is now supposed to be about 100 miles away. The President does not announce whether he will make or await an attack. Probably nothing decisive will take place for a week.

Paris, August 2--The press this afternoon says an attempt on the life of President Loubet was made yesterday at Rambouillet. A man fired a pistol at the president but the bullet went wild.
