Prominent Contractors and Capialisists L.ooking Over the Situation Here and Well Pleased

Nelson Bennett, capitalist and well known railroad contractor, left yesterday morning after having looked over the eituation, He is expected to be largely identified in the construction of the Great Central railroad. He made an examination of
the harbor, going out over the bar in a tugbont and aloo inspected the propertiee secured by the company for terminald and went over the Belt Line route with the view of familiarizing himeelf with the situation and all conditions. He exprensed himself as highly delighted with the nituation.
The advantager and excellence of the harbor were a revelation to him. The ease with which shipe arrive and depart through the entrance interested him greatly. However, he wat non committal as to detail of plane of the company, but that big development in the affairs of the Great Central railiroad are near at hand is the conviction of all closely observant of the moven being made by those supposed to have inside information.
W. 8. 8 mall, formeriy of Emall Bros., former Northem Peetfo raitroad contractor. is now located here with his tamilp. He has the contract for clearing and grading the Belt Line road ready for track laying. He is pushing he wore energetically.
