SERIOUS SITUATION AT
MOUTH OF COLUMBIA
That the situation at the mouth of the Coulmbia in eerions is amply shown by ha articles publiehed in the Portland papere. The Oregonian of the 1sth iest showa a chart of the mouth of the river, Lowing the proposed improvements follows:
The government engineers who will inspect the Colambia River and deter mine upon the improvemente for the bar
and Celilo Falis, sill arrive in Portland this morning from California.
The board which will investigate the bar will meet this morning at Captain W, C, Langfitt's office. It is composed of Major William L. Marshafl, of New York; Captain Edward Burr, instructor ton: Captain J. C. Sanford, in charge : Government worka at Charleston, S. C, Captuin Cassiue E, Gillette, in chargeat Savannah, and Captain Charles H. MeKinetry, instructor in the Engincering College at Washington.
It is impossible to forecast the doings of the engineera. The bar board will doubtless make a pereonal inspection fot the mouth of the-Columbia River, and will probably do so at once. They will determine whether to extend the jetty, according to present plans, or to attach a apur to it on the northern eide, 80 a er; or to build at jetty from Capo Disappaintmen).

The commercial intereste of Portland refully alive to the argeney of the situation on the bar. A minimum depth of only 20 feet in the bar channels han aroured cltizens to a full realiza!!on of the menace that confrents the shipping of this port. "If there is only 20 feet st aid a citizen yenterday, "that mean Junt 20 feet, and no more, for a channel is no deeper than ite shallowest part." The Chamber of Cotmmerce will urg apon the Government engineerr the exreme neriousness of the Columbia bar Cuanigation committre has madeclon examination of the sifuation, and at
Tuceday's menting of the trueteen submitter a report which was unabimousiy adopted. The report is as followe: It is fonnd that there are 21 feet of water for nearly a mile wide in the channel, which, connequently, at neap tides only allowe nome 23 or 29 feet of water on the bar. This ie a most serioue condition of water, and the committee regret to eay that at present tury see no means of relief.
"The board of engineern is to mee bere on Thureday, September 16, for the purpose of deciding what, if any, modiacatione are to be made in the presen plan of jetty work at the mouth" of the Columbia River, but owing to the lateness of che time when the river and harbor bill wae passed atd the money mait available we fear it will not be possible
for the United States engineere to make any materal difference beloro nex summer."
