Wilbur S. Sherwell Accused of Mur der--Trial Began Today Afier Lying in Jail Nearly a Year

Evanaville, Ided., Oet. $20-$ After many delaye the case of Wilbur 8. Bherwell, who in aceaned of murdern of the L "Jack the Ripper" type, was called for trial today. Bherwell han been in jail mearly a ycar. He was arrested Nov. 15 last, charged with ehoking to death Lena Renner and Georkia Railey, whose dead bodien a tow nighte betore had been found in ditches along roads lading into the eity. At the tume of his arrent Bherwell was a member of tio eity police torce. The aceused wat unable to give bail and hat been in jall ever pince. The grand fary that convened shortly after the bodien of the two women were tound indicted sherwell for their murdar a.jd tiso the murder of Mre. Mary Annile strok. The tody of Mre. Storck was found in almost the identical epat where the body of Mis Ralley was foand. Apparently the had been choked to death. In addition to thene three crimes the name of sherwell was connected with the marder of Fannie Batler, but the grand jary did not inuilet him for thia crime. The body of the Eutler woman was found in an allioy a year ago lant May. From all appearance the hay, been choked to death in the sume manner as had the three other vietims. It was ascertained that Sherwell had been talking to the Butuer woman on the night ehe dieappeared!
Slace hife arrest the prisoner has ateadily relueed to talk about his case beyond aserting bio innocence. Hiwile has atood by bim all through hie trouble, working in a mill to support herself and her two children. Able connel for the detense lias been retained by the mother and nilaters of Sherwell who tive at Monroevilite, $O$., and who are naid to bo wealthy. The trial promfies to be ore of the most notable in the criminal annale of the state.
