A HEROIC DEED

Injured Logger Carried 24 Miles by Comrades and Exples

The strenuous life of the woods has just furnished another story of courage, unconscious heroism and death in a Washington logging camp. Albert Lentz, a young employee at Kelb's logging camp, up the Wisbakah, was caught and pinned by a large log, and his left leg badly crushed. Mr. Kelb at once started on horseback for town, 25 miles distant, and 14 of the men improvised a stretcher and in relays carried the wounded man 24 miles to the boom, where he was met by Dr. Smith, and taken by boat the remainder of the way and put in the Aberdeen General Hospital, where all that medical science could do was done. The patient was brave and courageous, but the injury of the injuries and the shock proved fatal, as he died early in the morning of Thursday.

The body will be shipped to his home in Wisconsin. The men who brought him to the boom were nearly exhausted upon reaching there, as they had traveled as fast as possible without food, water or rest, but they were not conscious of doing anything unusual.
