### Flanagan & Bennett Bank



ELSEWHERE in this issue will be found a cut showing the interior of the above Bank, which is said to be one of the best arranged of any Country Bank in the State. The counter is made of home woods and shows the excellence of the maple, myrtle and white cedar knots, in contrast with the top of plate glass and brass oxidized copper.

This bank was organized in 1889 by P. Flanagan and J. W. Bennett. It has a subscribed capital of \$50,000.00, paid up capital \$40,000.00, undivided profits over \$30,000.00.

Many years after its organization it

was the only Bank on the southern coast of Oregon, and did whatever banking was needed for that section until recently, when the Myrtle Point Bank was established at Myrtle Point, and the First National Bank of Coquille City was established at the county seat. At North Bend a new bank is being established and the building for it will soon be completed.

Present indications show that within six months from now there will be four banks, where for many years the Flanagan & Bennett Bank was the only one. If the new institutions prove as convenient for the general public as the one first organized we shall feel gratified to see more of these institutions occupy the field, if indeed there is business for so many here.
