

SCHOONER LUCY ASHORE

Goes on the South Spit at the Umpqua

A report reached here last evening that the schooner Lucy, bound for the Umpqua had gone ashore at the mouth of the river and was in a dangerous situation.

It seems that the schooner arrived at the river and waited for the tug, but as the latter was here in the bay, the captain determined to sail in. When he left the Umpqua on his last trip the deepest water was to the south ward, but during his absence the channel had shifted to the north. Not knowing this the southern channel was taken, with result that the schooner piled up on the spit. The crew was taken off safely by the life saving crew. The tug Hunter was to go up today and try to free the schooner from her predicament, but the result had not been learned as we go to press.

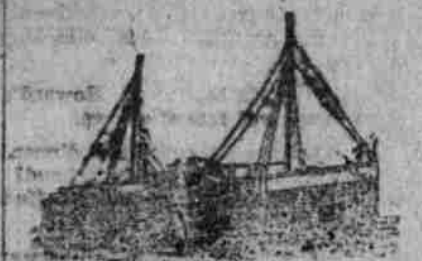

Daily Market Report

Fancy Coos Bay potatoes are still in demand in San Francisco and for the best there will be no trouble in getting \$1.15 today, but the farmers would do well to grade their stock more carefully, putting all the large potatoes by themselves and keeping the small ones at home. At the same time having their sacks crowded full. By doing this they will economize and their potatoes have a much more presentable appearance when they get in the city, but by all means the two sizes should be kept separate. Both will go for fancy stock and command equal prices, but certain trade wants a large potato while others want a medium size. By using a little more care along these lines, even an ordinary potato can be made saleable. The receipts of apples are falling off rapidly, but the stocks are still in excess. One San Francisco firm has had to close its doors on account of the loss sustained by the drop in apples.
