NORTH BEND GROWING

Many New Buildings--Woolen Mill Progressing Fast

A MAIL representative gleans the following notes on improvements at North Bend. Things are beginning to loom up, and in less than a year, if present indications count for anything, North Bend, will be one of the liveliest little manufacturing towns...

Porter mill and will be at work again the first of the week. A large scow has been secured with which to haul away the sand and waste dirt.

J. J. Burns the expert grader who has the contract for the grading work at North Bend is now at work grading the lower end of Virginia street to meet the approach to the main dock.

C. Peterson has purchased the corner lot at Sherman & California street, known as the old fish house. He will when it is completed have a building 21x36, two stories high which will be fixed up for a restaurant.

F. Brander of Santa Rosa, California who has purchased a lot between Union and Sherman on Virginia street has a building 21x40, two story, well under way. He expects to have it completed by April 1st, and will open a saloon and barber shop in it.

Nelson & Besman, who have the contract for the excavation for the new department store are forwarding the work with all possible expedition, and ere long work on the building proper can be begun. This store will be on the corner of Virginia street next to water.

E. S. Jordan is making rapid progress preparatory to the erection of his three story building which is to be 50x75 feet, the lower room to be used as a store, the second floor for offices and a large hall on the third.

Robert Marsden has the frame up for his building 60x60, which will be completed as soon as can be done by the available help.

Ground for the bank building is in readiness and as soon as the kiln of brick now being made by Mr. Laughhead is finished work on the building will begin.

All piling for the foundation for the new ship yard is now in and has been leveled down and in a short time it will be in readiness to receive the keel for the new vessel to be built there. The platform from Porter mill to the yard is now completed which will make the conditions perfect for getting material for ships on time. This is a great convenience and will expedite work on vessels.

The first floor for the woolen mill is ready and work on the framing and dimension stock is about ready for the main building which will soon be raised skyward. The structure will be three stories 80x200 with an annex the same size two stories high. A second annex 50x100 will be added for which the piling has all been driven.

Piledrivers are busily engaged driving piles to extend Virginia street to the main dock, a distance of 500 feet and 80 feet wide, which will be planked with cedar, joining the main dock which will be 240 feet by 1680 feet.

A large lot of new machinery has arrived for Porter mill, one of the important items of which is a band saw which will make this already valuable plant more proficient and second to none in Southern Oregon. A new large donkey engine for use in Simpsons logging camp also arrived and we are informed that in the near future the machinery for the new factory for wood work of all kinds and the shingle mill and sash and door factory will be received, probably by the next Alliance.
