A Grants Pass dispatch to the Telegram, dated April 17th says: Contracts for the grading of the Oregon & Pacific Railroad between Grant's Pass and Crescent City have been let.

STATE AND GENERAL NEWS.

Eugene has 22 lawyers and Albany has 26. Baker City is to have a new city hall to cost \$45,000. The Salem postoffice is now in the new federal building.

W Bailey, of Portland State Dairy and Food Commissioner was in Eugene looking after short-weight butter dealers and makers. He found that many farmers bring short weight rolls to town and has given warning which will no doubt, result in discontinuance of the practice.

Judge Clifford Wednesday evening sentenced George Lee to the penitentiary for two years for the killing of John A. Martin, of Jordan Valley, last Fall. Jasper Griffith was also sentenced to the penitentiary for one year for the shooting of John Roulson, at Nyasa, March 4 last.

E. Reames, of Jacksonville, Democrat; J. W. Ingle, of Corvallis, Socialist; and W. P. Elmore, of Brownsville, Prohibition.
