San Diego, Cal. Apr. 6-Subject to approval of the title by its attorneys, the Pacific Steel Co. today closed nego tiations for the purchase of four thous and acres of coal land, together with the railway and coking plant, owned by the Tacoma Coal and Coke Co, located 42 miles from Tacoma.

The purchase price is six hundred and fifty thousand, and the plan is to ship coke by the steamer from Tacoma, to be used by the thirty million dollar Packing Steel plant to be established here.
