Froops Retreat in Much Disorder

LEAVING ARMS AND AMMUNITION BEHIND

COURT Town of Antung, Burned by Retreating Russians---Valuable Plans Sold by Traitor---Warship Ashore

Yalu Victory Complete

London, May 2-The Central News Secul correspondent wires that the Japanese victory on the Yalu Sunday was most complete, the Russian lines being thrown into confusion and retiring in a disorderly manner.

Kuroki's Report

London, May 2-Japanese Minister Hayashi this morning issued a later report, by General Kuroki, regarding the Yalu fight. It is dated Kiuleng Cheng, ities. Manchuria, northeast of Antung, and reads "We advanced on May 1st along three roads, driving the enemy before us. At eight p. m., we captured the less of taxes, and the way to get rid of line from Antung Sien to Liusheuko. The Imperial guards surrounded the enemy on three sides, and after severe fighting, we captured the guns, beside the horses and carriages. The General Reserve corps, advancing along the Liaon I'ang road, saw the enemy fleeing towards Fenghuang Cheng.

The booty captured includes a large quantity of arms and ammunitions. captured officer says the commanders of both army divisions were mounted."
