MOUNT CARMIN, Penn., May 6 .-- Betweenten and eleven o'clock lastnight a terrible accident occurred on the Philadelphia and Reading railroad, between this city and Locust Gap. A freight train, con-sisting of seventy-five cars bound for Williamsport became disconnected by breaking of coupling. The engine and three cars ran half a mile before the crew discovered that the train was divided. 


