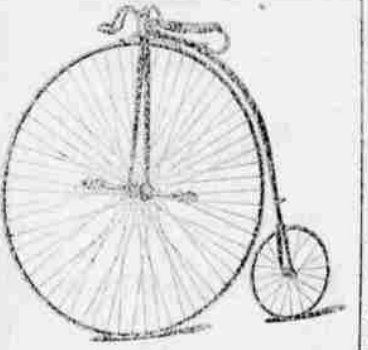
Teachers Examination.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

The Prohibitionists.
INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., May 29.—Arrivals to-day of delegates to the prohibition national convention, which assemblies to-morrow, have been numerous, and nearly all are on the grounds. Gov. St. John came in this afternoon, with the California delegation.
 As yet there is no certainty of the presence of Gen. Fiske, who has been detained, and may not arrive at all. The talk of the delegates is of much the same tenor as last evening. Gen. Fiske's name is the only one named for the head of the ticket. The second place has no new names suggested as yet.

CHICAGO, May 28.—W. F. Singleton, chairman of the Illinois prohibitionists, in an interview says that Clinton Fiske of New Jersey, will undoubtedly be nominated at Indianapolis, and Greenclay Smith for vice-president. The convention will advocate tariff reform.

His Mind Continues Clear.
WASHINGTON, May 29, A. M.—The favorable turn in General Sheridan's condition continues. He passed a very comfortable night and Mrs. Sheridan and the physicians are encouraged, though still apprehensive of a sudden change.

An Eastern Storm.
PITTSBURG, May 29.—The storm which swept over Eastern Ohio, West Virginia and Western Pennsylvania yesterday afternoon was of a very destructive character, and the aggregate loss to buildings, crops, and railroad and telegraph lines will cost up many thousand of dollars. Several lives were also sacrificed, and a number of persons injured. About Point Pleasant Huntingdon, West Virginia at Canton, Ohio, heavy regions the storm was particularly severe; the hail falling in masses, while the wind was very violent.
