

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., May 29 .- Arrivals to-day of delegates to the prohibition national convention, which assembles to-morrow, have been numerous, and nearly all are on the grounds. Gov. St. John came in this afternoon, with the California delegation.

The talk of the delegates is of much the same tenor as last evening. Gen. Fiske's name is the only one named for the head of the ticket. The second place has no new names suggested as yet. as yet.

CHICAGO, May 28.- W. F. Singleton chairman of the Illinois prohibitionists, in an interview says that Clinton Fiske of New Jersey, will undoubtedly be nominated at Indianapolis, and Greenclay Smith for vice-president. The convention will advocate tariff reform.
