Rich Lead Strike.

LEBANON, Mo., June 19.—Mr. L. W. Burris, Postmaster at Alman, Hickory county, about thirty-five miles northwest of here,was in this city to-day exhibiting some rich specimens which he took from a shaft he has sunk on his premises near the Little Niague river. He said that in a shaft four by six feet and twenty-eight feet deep he raised over 20,000 pounds of ore like the samples exhibited, which will yield not less than the per cent of pure lead. 
