### TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Fuller Confirmed.

**WASHINGTON, July 20.**—The Senate closed its doors at 12:30 p. m. to-day, and proceeded in secret to the formal consideration of Melville W. Fuller's nomination as chief justice of the United States supreme. At 1 o'clock the upper lobbies and upper committee rooms were cleared and the occupants driven down stairs, so that the doors and windows of the Senate chambers might be opened without risk of the betrayal of the proceedings. Fuller was confirmed. The vote was forty-one to twenty.

An Author Dead.

**NEWBURG, July 20.**—E. P. Roe died early this morning. Mr. Roe was the well known author of many popular novels, among them being "Barriers Burned Away," "A Tale of the Chicago Fire," and "The Earth Trembled, a Story of the Charleston Earthquake."

Died Game.

**MONTICELLO, N. Y., July 20.**—Jack Allen was hanged to-day for the murder of Ursula Ulrich at Jefferson last October. Allen had iron nerve and sang and prayed in a clear voice. He asked for whisky, which was refused. He put the noose around his own neck and said: "Let her go, Gallagher." The Sheriff then pulled the lever and Allen's body swung in the air. Allen was an Englishman, 30 years of age, and came to this country two years ago.

**NEW YORK, July 20.**—The Western Union Telegraph Company officially says there is no foundation for the report published in Carson City to the effect that Jay Gould had purchased Mackay's cable for \$11,000,000.

**BOSTON, July 20.**—John A. Levitt of Newton and Henry Simpson of England swam half a mile ocean pier this afternoon for the championship of America and a diamond badge valued at \$200. The American won by 1 minute and 20 seconds.

Sugar for Portland.

**SAN FRANCISCO, July 20.**—Confidence in the sugar markets is shown by the fact that the Oregon dock is now loaded with sugar for shipment to Portland to-morrow morning by the steamship State of California. There are fully 300 packages of refined sugar on the wharf, all for shipment to Mason, Ehrman & Co., the branch house of the San Francisco firm of Mason, Ehrman & Co. The value of the shipment is about \$30,000.

**SAN FRANCISCO, July 20.**—The Occidental hotel was the scene of unwonted festivities to-night, for which E. B. McElroy, state superintendent of public schools of Oregon, was responsible. He had tendered the delegates from this state a grand reception and had provided a string band to discourse music. The parlors and halls of the parlor floor had been profusely decorated by skilled hands with flags, flowers and Oregon fruits. Up stairs several rooms, including a portion of the hall, had been thrown together and set apart for a refectory where the choicest fruits and ice cream were served to all delegates. A great many visitors from the delegations of other states called, notably from California, and were regaled with all that was on hand. Pamphlets descriptive of Oregon in general, and Portland, Roseburg and other cities in particular, were distributed. The walls of the rooms upstairs had been hung with paintings and sketches by Oregon people.
