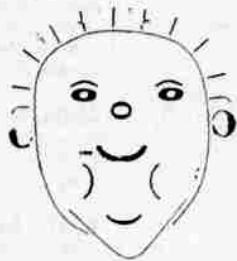

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Remanded to China.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 23.—Fifteen of the fifty-one Chinamen who were released from the steamer Belgic last week, on the plea they were merchants, were remanded to China to-day by Judge Sawyer, at the request of their attorneys, who admitted that the men could not be classed as merchants. The genuine Chinese merchants here say they are glad this barefaced attempt to evade the exclusion act has failed so completely and ignominiously.

Rioting in Ireland.

DUBLIN, Oct. 23.—A riot broke out at Moy to-day between Orangemen and nationalists. The police were reinforced and charged the mob with bayonets. Several police were injured with stone thrown by the rioters.

The Crows.

ST. PAUL, Oct. 23.—A dispatch from Standing Rock agency says it is reported that 200 Crow warriors have taken the war path against the Sioux. It is not known what the cause is, but a troop of cavalry and some Indian police have been sent out to investigate.
