The Boxers

WASHINGTON, June 16.—Advises from Peking says "Boxers" have destroyed every consulate in the city besides murdering German consul. The German consul is a son-in-law of a railroad magnate in Detroit, whose wife was with him and it is supposed she was killed also.

LONDON, June 16.—The Allpekin legation is destroyed. The German minister Baron Von Kettler was killed. Tien Tain is in hand of the boxers. Three American and English churches and several foreigners' residences were burned. Several big incendiary fires. There is an awful panic among the Chinese.

WASHINGTON, June 16.—The government can't hear from China and unless wire is received soon men will be sent from Manila for information.

To Kootenai Mines via the O R & N

The Spokane Falls & Northern Railway will change time, and will establish double daily train service between Spokane and Roseland, close connection being made for all Kootenai territory.

Day train will leave Spokane 10:35 a. m., arrive Roseland 5:30 p. m., arrive Nelson 8:00 p. m. Night train will leave Spokane 9:45 p. m., arrive Roseland 6:30 a. m., carrying a palace sleeper.

Passengers arriving at Spokane on O. R. & N. No. 4 at 9:00 a. m., make close connection with the S. F. & N. day train, and arriving at Spokane on the O. R. & N. No. 8 at 5:45 p. m., made good connection with the S. F. & N. night train.

The War.

LONDON, June 16.—Lord Roberts' dispatches leave affairs east of Pretoria with the Boers withdrawn to new positions on Tuesday. The news of fresh fighting is expected at the war office but none came last night.

General Rundle's patrol had a skirmish with the Boer videttes again on Wednesday. Some wonder is expressed here as to what he is doing with three divisions.

Almost a War.

LONDON June 16.—This is the situation in China as it appears to the Shanghai correspondent of the Daily Express, cabling last evening:

"It is really a state of veiled war. The members of the foreign legations in Peking are virtually prisoners, and the Chinese troops are only restrained from attacking them by fear of fear of the legation guards."

An Oregon Man.

New York, June 15.—The body of a man with the throat cut from ear to ear was discovered today in the upper bay. An autopsy showed that the cut had been inflicted before the body entered the water. In his pockets were an account-book with the inscription on the outside, "Ladd & Tilton, Portland, Or."

Republican Convention.

PHILADELPHIA, June 15.—Speculation, gossip and informal conferences today, among the national committeemen and other leading republicans who are here has failed to indicate a crystallization of sentiment around any individual for the Vice-Presidential nomination. Neither Senator Hanna nor those who are close to him give any intimation that the administration has a choice.

Quarantine Dissolved

SAN FRANCISCO, June 15.—In the U. S. circuit court, Judge Morrow rendered a decision in the case of Jew Ho against the Board of Health of this city, dissolving the general quarantine of Chinatown enforced by the Board of Health, owing to the alleged existence of plague in this city. Morrow held that the quarantine was discriminatory in its character.

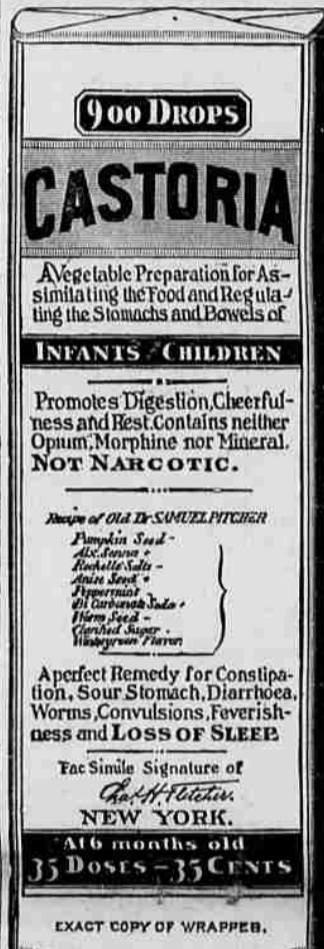
