Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Albany, Oregon, held on the 13th day of February, 1900, the following resolution was adopted and order made.

Resolved, That the wagon bridge now located in the city of Albany and extending across the Willamette river and being partially in Linn and Benton counties at this time unsafe to be used by the traveling public.

Therefore it is hereby ordered by the Common Council of the city of Albany that all travel be suspended on said bridge from this time until further notice given by the said council and that due notice be given to the public of the suspension of travel over and along said bridge by publishing a copy of this resolution and order in the ALBANY DEMOCRAT a newspaper of general circulation in Linn and Benton counties Oregon, during the pleasure of a Id Council and further by posting printed copies of this resolution and order at the approaches of said bridge on either side thereof in conspicuous places.
