Will Get Nothing.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 13.—The Chinese residents of the recently quarantined district of this city are preparing to demand compensation for losses alleged to have been sustained owing to the action of the health officials. Detailed lists of losses are being prepared which are expected to form the basis for a suit for a suit for damages, estimated by the attorneys at about \$2,000,000 against the City of San Francisco or of a claim for about that amount against the Federal government.

Boxers Defeated.

BRUSSELS, July 13.—The Belgian foreign office has received a cable dispatch from Shanghai announcing, on Chinese authority that General Ni Chang has defeated the rebels near Pekin and has released Prince Ching and General Yung Lu, who were trying to defend the Europeans.

England Chagrined.

NEW YORK, July 13.—A dispatch to the Tribune from London says: There was a feeling of deep chagrin toward midnight when the news spread in the lobbies of Parliament that Lord Roberts had reported a Boer success, 18 miles from Pretoria, with the capture of a squadron of the Scots Greys and a part of five companies of the Lincolnshire regiment and two guns.

Nothing New.

LONDON, July 14.—The scanty cable dispatches received today add nothing to the knowledge in London of the Chinese situation. It is stated positively from Canton that Li Hung Chang will remain there until the allied troops have defeated Prince Tuan's forces and will then go north to lend his powerful aid in arranging terms of peace, co-operating with Prince Ching, Yung Lu and the other pro-foreign viceroys.

Lewis's Opinion.

WASHINGTON, July 13.—James Hamilton Lewis is in Washington proclaiming the election of Bryan but announcing that he is personally out of politics, national and state as far as holding office is concerned. The turn down he received at Kansas City evidently put a damper on his political aspirations but he takes revenge by predicting that Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana and even New York will go democratic this fall.

A Cry of Despair.

NEW YORK, July 13.—A dispatch to the Tribune from London says: It is frankly admitted in official circles that there have been no authentic advices from European sources in 18 days, and that that the last word was a cry of despair.

MOTHERLESS TWIN BABES.—Motherless twin girl babes, passing through Portland to their future home in Eastern Oregon, attracted much attention at the Union Depot yesterday morning. They were born January 4, 1900, at Grant's Pass, and their mother died giving them birth. Their names are Orpha and Oia Peckenpaugh. For five months they were with a family at Silverton, but a permanent home has been found for them in Harbman, about twenty miles from Heppner. Mrs. Mary S. Thompson, who is president of the W. C. T. U., of that place, takes both of them.—Oregonian. Mrs. Peckenpaugh was a resident of Albany for several years and was the daughter of Jas. Shahan, of Mill City.
