CLEVELAND, Oct. 31.—A sensation occurred during a political meeting in the public square today, in which Mayor Johnson struck William Myleraine, a republican tax board official, in the face with his fist. According to the statement of bystanders the Mayor overheard Myleraine assert that he was a liar.

Big Shipment.
PORTLAND, Oct. 31.—North Pacific ports in the month closing yesterday broke all previous records for wheat and hour shipments. Portland alone shipped 2,256,223 bushels and Seattle and Tacoma combined ran the total for Oregon and Washington ports up to over 5,000,000 bushels.

Burned to Death.

From the Lebanon E. A.:

A very sad affair occurred one mile west of Sodaville Thursday evening. The house on the Hill place, occupied by Henry Vollstedt and family, burned down, and the eight-year-old son of Mr. Vollstedt was consumed in the flames.

The fire occurred between 4 and 5 o'clock, while Mr. Vollstedt was out some distance at work and Mrs. Vollstedt was out milking. Mrs. Vollstedt is almost deaf and did not notice the fire until the house was enveloped in flames. She ran to the house and endeavored to rescue her son, who was an invalid and unable to get out himself, but she was unable to reach him. She was badly burned about the face and arms, but would probably have continued her attempts until fatally burned had not a neighbor reached the scene and got her out of the house. Mr. Vollstedt arrived soon after the fire, but the boy and everything in the house were entirely consumed. Mrs. Vollstedt was taken to the home of a neighbor, Mr. Westcott, and Dr. J. C. Booth was called to attend her. He reports that she will recover.

The Mormons.

The Mormons have obtained a strong hold in Eastern Oregon within the past three years. 200 of them have settled in Grant's Ronde valley. They have purchased some of the choicest farms on the Sand Ridge and divided them into 20, 40 and 80 acre tracts, and are raising sugar beets principally. At La Grande they have a church building with a seating capacity for about 600 people. They own the best sugar factory, have recently purchased the plant of the Grande Ronde Lumber Co. at Perry, by far the most complete in that section, the Steel Spur saw mill, the Hilgard planer and all the available timber near these mills. They have a grocery store, paint store, jeweler, lard and real estate agents, lawyers and other business men in La Grande, besides a thriving community at Alced and Union. Several are now in Albany, but there is no likelihood of their securing a following here, though they are persistent, quiet and not easily discouraged.

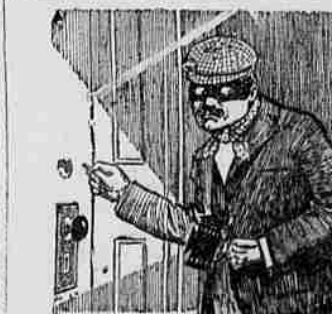
