TELEGRAPHIC.

A Fatal Torpedo.
TUSCALOOSA, Ala., Jan. 22.—A disastrous tornado swept over Moundville, a town of 300 inhabitants, 15 miles south of here, early today, and as a result 37 persons were killed, and more than 100 injured. Every business house, with the exception of a small store, was completely destroyed.
The tornado struck the city from the southwest and mowed a path a quarter of a mile wide through the town.

Japan Warring.
LONDON, Jan. 22.—The correspondent of the Morning Post at Chefoo has sent in an alarming report that 12,000 Japanese troops have landed at Masamphy, in Southern Korea and the Port Arthur correspondent of the New York Herald refers in a dispatch to the fact that the news of the occupation of Masamphy is being received calmly.

Eastern Ice.
NEW YORK, Jan. 22.—Long Island sound is a compact ice field from shore to shore and from Hell Gate to New Haven, Conn. Only the largest steamers went through during the night and unless there is a thaw navigation is likely to be closed at once. Hundreds of sailing vessels and big, ocean-going tugs are frozen in the fields with their tows.

Bad for Oregon.
WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—The river and harbor committee of the House today decided against substituting an appropriation bill at this session of Congress. The decision is a great surprise, and is regretted very much by the Oregon delegation.

A Pleasant Affair.
BAKER CITY, Jan. 22.—The execution of the condemned murderer, Pleasant Armstrong, was carried out without a hitch under the direction of Sheriff H. K. Brown, this morning. Several visiting officials who have witnessed numerous executions said they never witnessed one that was better arranged in every detail.

In the Senate.
WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—The Senate today adopted the resolution of inquiry concerning affairs in Panama introduced in January 5 by Gorman, and listened to a speech on the Panama question by Doliver and another on the subject of recess appointments.
