The Doings of the World

At Mu-den.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 1.—It is admitted that the Japanese advance has already begun along the whole line, assuming its most active form in the east whither Field Marshal Oyama continues to draft large forces. Operations are also in progress west of the railroad. An associated press Harbin dispatch contains the announcement that the Japanese have occupied Siaobeyho, west of the Liao River, whence they are evidently threatening Simmintin.

Peported Fignt.

London, Oct. 1.—According to the Morning Post's Shanghai correspondent it is reported there that the Japanese have been victorious in a general engagement at Mukden.

Tokio, Oct. 1. — Reports received from the seat of war indicate that Field Marshal Oyama has determined to make the return of the Russians south of Mukden an impossibility, even if the battle expected to take place to the north of the city should turn out in their favor. The Yentai mines have been converted into a stronghold, easy to defend and almost impregnable.

TIENTSIN, Oct. 1.—Russian officers here admit it is the intention of the remaining Russian war vessels at Port Arthur to attempt to escape. They say that they expected the movement one week ago, and it may now be expected daily.

Bellingham, Wash., Sept. 30.—For the unrequited love of May Clevish, a country girl, Con Hayden, a young man of Mountain View, last night placed the muzzle of a Marlin rifle to his breast and shot himself. For three hours his life lingered. The death he sought came early in the morning. Among his effect were found letters from the girl to himself, and on the back of love novel was the simple statement that showed that he intended to kill himself.


