COMPLETELY SURROUNDED.

The Russians Demoralized and Fit to Surrender.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 11.—(Special)—It is admitted the Russians lost 60,000 prisoners and three hundred guns at Mukden. Officers are reported to have signed a round robin to Kuropatkin requesting his surrender. Fighting still continues in the vicinity of Mukden. The Japanese are following up the successes of yesterday and are pursuing the remnants of the Russian army, which is suffering heavy losses.

PORTLAND, March 11. (Special).—Governor Chamberlain stated today that he will not call an extra session of the Legislature.

The Seedless Apple Palm.

PORTLAND OR. Mar. 11.—Washington and Oregon apple growers have snatched the palm from John F. Spencer, of Colorado who has advertised himself as the inventor of the seedless apple. The honor belongs to J. L. Colburn, of White Salmon, Washington and Mel. Fenwick, of Harney County, Oregon.

Mr. Colburn states that he has for a number of years grown an apple on his orchard that is seedless. The tree does not bloom but bears full each year. Last year it grew eight or ten bushels. The apples are of good size and well flavored.

The apple grown by Mr. Fenwick is a solid one and has no core. It is large, fine flavored and a good keeper, resembling in color a blue winter pearmain.

A Big Victory.

TOKIO, Mar. 11.—The Japanese wedge driven through the Russian center on the Hun River continues to advance north. It has already arrived at Ham-pu, some distance northeast of Mukden.

It is reported that the Russians are retiring north along the railway, every badly confused, being caught between the wedge and the extreme Japanese left, northwest of Mukden.

Is Surrounded.

LONDON, Mar. 11.—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Times wires that the latest message from General Kuropatkin read as follows: "I am surrounded."

The Russian Disaster.

TOKIO, Mar. 11.—The full extent of the Russian disaster is still unknown here. It is known, however, that the casualties and losses in guns and munitions of war are enormous. Even approximate figures are unobtainable as yet. It is expected that the prisoners will number many thousands. Local estimates of the number vary from 20,000 to 50,000.

NEWBERG, Or., Mar. 10.—One of the most decisive victories in the history of the Oregon Intercollegiate Association was won in the Friends' Church this evening here by Walter R. Miles, representing Pacific College, of Newberg, who received first honors both in composition and in delivery. John D. Withycombe, of the Oregon Agricultural College was second, and Andrew Marker, of Willamette University, was third.

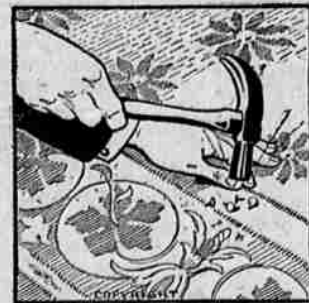
