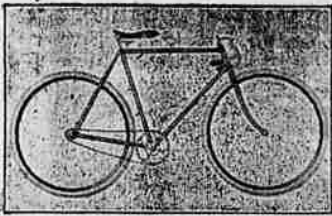

MANY INDICTMENTS

By the U. S. Grand Jury.

PORTLAND, April 8.—(Special)—The Federal Grand Jury this afternoon returned the following indictments: Against State Senator Robert A. Booth, James H. Booth, L. E. Singleton, John Doe, Richard Roe, William Roe, Thomas Roe, officials of the Booth Kelly Lumber Company, charging conspiracy with I. Thomas Agee to defraud the U. S. out of public lands.

Against Frank Alley, A. R. Downs, Stephen W. Furnell, and John Doe, charging conspiracy with John W. Gardner and others to defraud the government out of public lands.

Against Willard N. Jones, Thaddeus S. Potter, H. L. Sissler, Daniel Clark, also for conspiracy.

Against James H. Booth for furnishing F. A. Kribs advance information to aid him in scripping operations while Booth was official in Roseburg land office.

Against C. D. Bernard, Clarence D. Hachery and Charles A. Watson for perjury.

John Cordano, ex-district Attorney John Hall, Major Harry L. Rees, A. Taylor, J. H. Hitchings, John Northup, C. Lord, are reported as having conspired to retard justice, though no indictments are returned against them.

It Means a Naval Fight.

SINGAPORE, April 8.—The belief is general here that a desperate engagement for the control of the seas is imminent off here between the Japanese defensive fleet, under the command of Admiral Togo, and the Russian fleet commanded by Vice-Admiral Rojensky. The two fleets are rapidly approaching each other.

Body Identified.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 7.—Positive identification was given the dismembered body found Wednesday night at Vallejo and Powell streets, yesterday afternoon, off Meiggs' wharf, when Peter Antonio Crespano Conello called at the morgue tonight and declared the mutilated body to be that of his half brother, Biaggio Villardo, an Italian laborer.

Scio.

The News: Joe Young started for Nebraska, Friday, for the purpose of buying and bringing to Scio a fine Percheon stallion. He expects to return by the 10th of the month.

H. D. Landon, one of the practical lumbermen of Salem, has moved to our city and will become a permanent resident. He has a fine mill property up in Bilpeu, which he will at once place in operation.

For the past year the Scio railroad has not been operated and during the winter the engine was taken to Portland. Now, we understand, the road is to be placed in condition again and the present season promises to be quite a busy one from a freight viewpoint. The Hall Lumber Co. have a contract for two million feet of bridge timber and 50,000 ties for the S. P. company, John Cyrus a contract for 50,000 ties, the Miller company for another 25,000 and several other smaller lots.

The salaries of all the county officials of Bannock county but the treasurer were reduced by the last legislature and will be as follows after July 1, 1906: judge \$720, sheriff \$1,600, clerk \$1,440, recorder \$800, treasurer \$500, school superintendent \$800, assessor \$300.

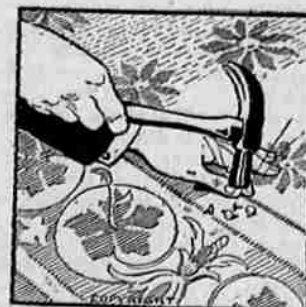
