Former State Senator C. M. Brown, of Marion county, Fla., has filed notice of a suit for \$25,000 damages against The Metropolis, an afternoon paper of Jacksonville. The basis of the suit is the charge made by that paper that the Senator accepted and rode on a railroad pass. Under the Flordia law it is a crime for senators or representatives to pass. Onder the Florida law it is a crime for senators or representatives to accept or ride on free passes, and the charge of the same is equivalent to the charge of a crime. The declaration in the case will be filed in June. Brown was recently unseated in the Senate by the contest of Baskins, of Marion.—Ex.


