Death of Abram Underhill.

Corvallis Times:
The funeral of Abram Underhill, for 30 years a citizen of Benton occurred today at Hulbert chapel, across the river in Linn. The service was conducted by Rev. Hurd of Corvallis. The deceased was born in Vermont May, 29, 1825, and at 13 moved to Illinois. In 1855 he went to Brooklyn, Iowa, in 1875 to Albany, Oregon, 1877 to Summit, Benton county, in 1886 to Philomath, where two years ago Mrs. Underhill died. Since that time he has lived among his children who are, H. Underhill and Mrs. McFarland, Summit; Mrs. Hulbert, Albany and Mrs. Bogue, Gold Hill. He was aged 81 years, three months and 28 days. He was married in 1854 to Olive Marvel of Prophetown, Illinois.

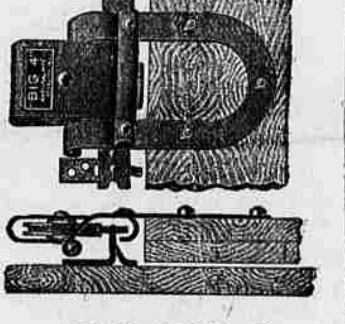
