ALBANY COLLEGE WINS.

Albany College 12--Eugene High School 0.

The foot ball teams of Albany College and Eugene High School met on the local field yesterday in a desperate battle for the valley secondary championship. The two teams were quite evenly matched and played a most excellent article of football. Albany kicked off to Eugene and immediately began the march for the visitors goal. A touchdown was made in the first half, the attempt for the goal failed. At the end of the first half the score was Albany College 5, Eugene High 0. In the second half immediately after the kick off Albany again began the march for the Eugeneses goal and in a very few minutes had forced the visitors so near their goal so that when assaying a kick Gibbons broke through, blocked the attempt and fell on the ball for a safety. This added two more points to the Albany score. Again kicking off by a series of rapidly executed plays Albany carried the ball down the field for a touchdown in six minutes. A try for the goal failed. Game closed with ball in possession of Albany on the visitors ten yard line. Score at end of game: Albany 12, Eugene 0. Hans P. Flo and Arnsperger acted as officials. The game was fiercely contested and Eugene put up as stubborn a defense as ever seen on the local field. Two of Albany's best players were seriously injured and may be out of the game for the rest of the season. Yates and Rogaway were the unfortunate ones. Beeson carried the ball over for the touchdown in the first half. On account of the slippery condition of the field, fumbles were frequent and the kicking of a goal almost an impossibility.
