### News from Albany's Six Early Trains.

"Looks like Portland," said some one at the depot this morning, after a big crowd of O. A. C. students and others had gotten off the train from that live town up the river, Corvallis, filling the depot and covering the platform. But there was plenty of room. At least a dozen bunches of mistletoe gave the crowd a Christmas aspect.

Mr. and Mrs. Tip Humphrey, of Jefferson, returned home after an Albany visit. Mr. Humphrey owns four lots in Goltra Park, which he is keeping for his old age, a long way off, for Tip is about as young as twenty years ago. The lots have over doubled in price the last year or two; but they are not for sale.

Mrs. Frank Reeves, a popular Jefferson lady, returned home after looking over Albany's fine shopping district.

A couple of ministers in the crowd, Rev. M. C. Wire, district superintendent of the M. E. church, formerly called presiding elder, on his way home from a trip up the Springfield road; and Rev. E. B. Jones, of Corvallis, formerly located at Tangent.

The immense ponds on the S. P. grounds around the depot, suggest the need of the drainage promised several weeks ago; but it will come. Then too that new cement walk from the depot past the terminus of the new lightning express, is sadly needed. Mighty poor walking along the mixture of mud and Grants Pass sand.

A letter was read from A. Welch in reference to hydrant service offering to give figures for a contract upon information as to member of cisterns by drains and time of contract.

The Park committee reported several sites in view, one of ten or twelve acres owned by the Hackleman estate, and also ten or twelve acres owned by the Burkhardt Bros. with numerous excellent privileges. A survey is being made. Continued.

Petition of W. A. Sharp et al, asked for a sewer through block H's 2nd addition. Referred.

Ordinance bill 506, granting Barrett Bros. the privilege of erecting a corrugated iron building was read three times and passed. Aye, Dawson, Marshall, Miller, Tomlinson; No—Hand, Wilmot.

An ordinance granting the Albany Preserving Co., the privilege of running a track across Jackson street was read and referred.

An ordinance was read prohibiting the sale of near beer in Albany, with a fine of \$50 to \$100, and imprisonment of 25 to 50 days. Referred to committee on licenses.

Application of John Catlin for position of poundmaster. Continued.

The matter of a park was discussed and Councilman Miller was appointed to confer with the Commercial Club on the subject.
