### MANDAMUS

To Compel Referendum of the Near Beer Ordinance.

In the case of Chas. Kroeschel agt. F. M. Redfield, Recorder of Albany, papers were filed to-day, with an order compelling the defendant to show cause on Jan. 16, at 1 p. m., at Albany, why the near beer ordinance should not be referred to the voters of Albany, under the referendum law.

The petition for the referendum is signed by 128 voters of the city. The petition for the referendum was presented to the recorder on Jan. 7, and the filing of it was refused. The ordinance was passed by the council on Dec. 29, four members, all present, voting yes, and it was signed by the mayor next day. It is charged that the necessary three-fourths of the council did not vote for the ordinance. P. R. Kelly and L. M. Curl are attorneys for the plaintiff.

Recorder Redfield states that demurrer will be filed and the case contested.
