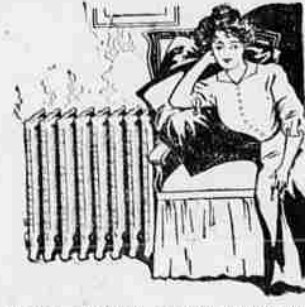

KEROSENE DID IT.

ABERDEEN, Wash., Sept. 18.—(Special)—In a fire which reduced the residence of his brother to a heap of ashes, Anton Kapuzewski was rescued through a veritable sea of flames at 2 o'clock this morning by a chance passerby who discovered the blaze only after practically the entire house was afire.

The owners of the home were at the Exposition and the brother, who had been left in charge, returned home late and fell asleep with the lamp full and lit, near a curtain. To this cause is attributed the conflagration, which was not quelled until adjoining houses on both sides had been seriously damaged.

The fact that the entire neighborhood was asleep gave the flames a strong start and when Theodore Kinsed was passing, practically every room was ablaze. The occupant was smothered by smoke and flames, and kindred, rushing into the house, saved him at the risk of his own life, actually passing through fire to carry him out. The horse and contents are a total loss with but \$800 insurance on both.
