## DEATH OF GEO. SIMPSON.

Geo. W. Simpson, died at his home on Washington street yesterday afternoon, after an illness of some time, of a complication of troubles, his heart and kidneys being affected. He was cheerful and brave to the last, with all his suffering.

He was born in Philadelphia on June 27, 1861 and came to Oregon with father, Rev. Anthony Simpson and family in 1885, settling in Corvallis, where he resided for many years. For a number of years he was a purser on a coast steamer. Several years ago he came to Albany, where he has since resided. He was a member of the Presbyterian church. He leaves a wife, brother, J. H. Simpson, and sister, Mrs. M. S. Woodcock, of Corvallis.

The funeral services will be held on Monday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, at the family residence, 713 Washington street, to which all friends are invited.
