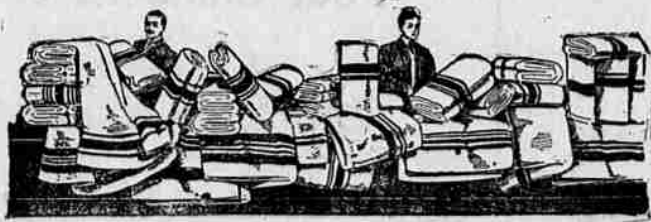

The prevailing price was 3 to 4 cents, according to grade, which means approximately \$100,000 paid out here for prunes. The business is well managed and is prospering under the Northwest Fruit Association.
