The most important provision of the law imposes a penalty of \$200 fine and six months in prison for racing on the highway or running an automobile recklessly, or attempting to escape after injuring a person. Another stringent provision is imprisonment of one or two years for anyone detected running an automobile while under the influence of intoxicating liquor. The law also forbids the running of a motor vehicle by anyone under 18 years of age.
