## A PANAMA PAPER

Tells of 237 Inches of Rain in a Year.

The Democrat appreciates a copy of The Canal Record, of Acoon, Canal Zone, of Jan. 26.  
People who think it rains here maybe started with the record of 237.29 inches in a year at Porto Bello, in 1909. The wettest month was December, 58.17 inches, 18 inches more than Albany's average rainfall for a whole year. The driest month was March, 3.56 inches. July, a dry month here, showed 25.33 inches. The Atlantic side, where Porto Bello is, is much wetter than the Pacific side of the isthmus.  
The canal work is divided into three sections, Atlantic, Central and Pacific, and the progress of the work is shown. 2,275 men are at work, and the monthly excavations are nearly 3,000,000 yards, besides the large amount of concrete work, track laying and relaying, rock crushing, sewers and water mains built, drains and ditches dug, etc.  
They play base ball there between the showers, having two Leagues with Gorgona, Acoon, Empire and Marines in one, and Com. Sub., P. K. R., Civ. Ad. and Colon in the other on the Atlantic side.
