### A PANAMA **PAPER**

Tells of 237 Inches of Rain in a Year.

The Democrat appreciates a copy of The Canal Record, of Acoon, Canal Zone, of Jan. 26.

People who think itrains here maybe startled withlche record of 237.29 inches in a year at Porto Bello, in 1909. The wettest month was December, 58.17 inches, 18 inches more than Albany's average rainfall for a whole year. The dryest month was March, 3.56 inches, July, a dry month here, showed 25.33 inches. The Atlantic side, where Porto Bello is, is much wetter than the Pacific side of the isthmus.
