Roseburg has just raised \$20,000 bonds at home for paving, at 4 1/2c.

Harrisburg wants a jeweler. The one there has quit the business in order to accept a position in a lumber mill.

The Review says the Oregon Electric will cross the Santiam about a mile north of Jefferson, opening up a new country along the Willamette.

Rev. Wright of the Baptist church, Eugene, has resigned to accept the chaplainship of the Oregon State Reformatory at Monroe, Wash. Rev. Wright was in Albany yesterday.

S. M. Garland, W. M. Brown and A. M. Reeves were appointed a committee at Lebanon to secure the Oregon Electric in case the road skipped Albany, and it can have any street it wants in Lebanon.

The Western Prohibition League oratorical contest will take place at McMinnville May 30, with seventeen colleges represented, from Washington, California, Idaho and Oregon. The winner will go to Valparaiso, Ind., in June for a national contest.

Councilman Jacobs, of the McMinnville council, in the city yesterday said the Oregon Electric would go through a principal residence street of their city, that a few would have preferred something else, but considered the public good first and made no protest.
