Seattle, June 11.—Fire late last night on the water front in northern part of the city destroyed ten blocks, bounded by Railroad avenue, just east of the harbor front, Third avenue, Wall and Ninth streets.

The loss is estimated at \$1,000,000 and probably a number of lives were lost.

The fire was under control at 12:45 a. m. It is impossible to confirm or deny the reports of loss of life.
