





DOINGS OF A PAMPHLET ON TAXATION.

The Democrat has received a copy of a pamphlet published by W. G. Eggles-ton, and A. D. Cridge and W. S. U'Ren, on the subject of taxation, be-ing an advocacy of the land tax values instead of the present system. It cov-ers 117 pages, and is headed by the the American flag and ends with a pic-ture of a red dagger recking with blood, entitled "The Oregonian. Lest We For get." A table is given showing how much would be saved under the land tax system. For instance, the assess-ment in Linn county would be \$4,755,618 on farmers land, \$7,619,395 on specula-tor's lands, \$697,790 on improved city lots, the same on speculator's city lots and \$2,077,263 on franchise corporations, a total of \$15,710,857, against \$25,315,-880 under the present system, under the proposed system buildings, stock, im plementa, improvements, and all per-sonal things being exempt. The spec-ulaters and corporations would thus pay \$24,460 taxes and the farmers and owners of improved city lots \$114,083. Tothing on their money, and per-haps they don't anyway. 
