## A PAMPHLET ON TAXATION.

The Democrat has received a copy of a pamphlet published by W. G. Eggleston, and A. D. Cridge and W. S. U'Ren, on the subject of taxation, being an advocacy of the land tax values instead of the present system. It covers 117 pages, and is headed by the picture of a red dagger reeking with blood, entitled "The Oregonian. Let Us Forget." A table is given showing how much would be saved under the land tax system. For instance, the assessment in Linn county would be \$4,758,618 on farmers land, \$7,619,395 on speculator's lands, \$897,790 on improved city lots, the same on speculator's city lots and \$2,077,263 on franchise corporations, a total of \$15,719,857, against \$25,315,880 under the present system, under the proposed system buildings, stock, implements, improvements, and all personal things being exempt. The speculators and corporations would thus pay \$218,460 taxes and the farmers and owners of improved city lots \$114,083. Total \$332,543. Merchants would pay nothing on their goods, and money lenders nothing on their money, and perhaps they don't anyway. In short it is a single tax argument in favor of a couple numbers to be voted on at the coming election.

### A Little Fire Bug.

Lebanon E. A. As Jos. Smith and Geo. Chamberlain were going into Albany this forenoon, after doing some work on the Albany canal, they found smoke issuing from a large pile of railroad ties just outside the city, and upon investigating found that someone had kindled a fire under the pile just a few moments before. All the kindling had not yet burned, and if they had happened along just a little sooner they might have caught the "firebug." Maybe it was the work of some tramp who had been put off a train.

### Over on Nye Creek.

Albany people having property at the Bay, at least some of them, are getting it in the neck, perhaps more correctly, in the pocketbook, at Nye Creek, Newport. One man's outhouse was cleaned up and a bill of \$33 presented and paid. All property owners are required to connect with the new water system and pay for water six months a year, though only there a month or two. Summer resort property comes high.

It is claimed the road is not in shape for traffic of any kind. So far it has been used simply as a logging road, with a car for passengers, running almost any old time, never regularly. The people want some kind of a time-card service and the road bed made safe.
