New Money Order.

Beginning Sept. 1 there will be an entirely different system of orders, a new form being arranged. It will consist of a long sheet of paper upon which there are apparently two orders exactly alike, and a receipt stub. The latter is detached and both of the former sent. The paying post office detaches one to send to Washington with his reports and files the other for future use. It will be necessary to retain the stub for protection.

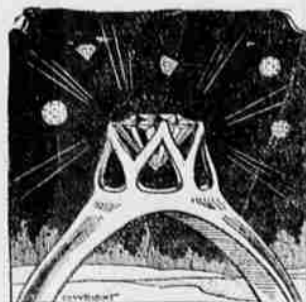
