**TAKE THE SALOONS OUT OF POLITICS.**

**The Home Rule Association Promises Such a Remedy.**

They promise us prohibition on several points on which we have prohibition already. The Home Rulers believe in prohibition in part for men and in whole for women. "No woman shall be allowed to enter saloons." They say saloons must be better regulated and the laws must be made stronger and must be NOW enforced. They confess that so far regulation has been a failure. How are they going to divorce saloons from politics? By taking it out of the hands of the City Council and putting it where? In the Courts. They say in effect, "As councilmen are elected by voters they feel under obligation to those who help them get elected. They stand in with the saloon power to get elected. Therefore, take the license power away from the City Councils." But Attorney-General Crawford says their amendment "vests in the City Council the exclusive power to control the sale of liquor." Before their proposed constitutional amendment is adopted they propose to amend it! Read the Attorney-General's opinion given at the request of the Liquor Dealers' Aid Society and compare it with their promised law. But does putting the licensing power in the hands of the courts take saloons out of politics? Does it? Are the liquor dealers to appoint our judges? If our judges are to be elected—and they are—then putting the licensing power in their hands means to make the Courts THE FOOTBALL OF SALOON POLITICS. All those opposed to this iniquitous scheme vote 329 X No and vote it HARD.

**AGAIN**—They intend to make the purchaser equally guilty with the seller. Why, of course. Then the buyer cannot testify against the seller without convicting himself, and the seller cannot testify against the buyer without convicting himself and the laws can be violated by the saloons as they will. This will be a fine thing for the saloons. This will divorce the saloons from the LAW all right. All opposed to this scheme vote 329 X No and vote it hard.
