WAR SCARE

A Colossal Fraud in the Interest of the Armament Contractors.

Washington, Dec. 16. - That war scares largely are inspired by "armament contractors who ultimately would drag various countries into the bankruptcy court," was charged by Francis W. Hirst, editor of the London Economist, in an address at the International conference of American society for judicial settlement of international disputes, tonight. He characterized as absurd the purchase of dreadnaughts by Brazil to protect itself against Argentina and said rivalry between the United States and Japan was crushing the people of Japan under a load of taxes, while armament expenses were wrecking Great Britain and Germany.
