Frank Barrett left on a Portland trip.

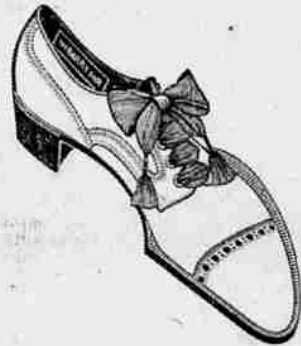

## THE DEVIL'S PERSONALITY.

At the afternoon session yesterday Dr. Riley made it plain that the church that is going to prosper must be governed by spirit led people. Not only the minister but the choir and all the officers of the church should be genuine Christians, not unbelievers or the unfaithful because of their talents or wealth.

There was a good attendance at the evening session, but there is room for many more.

Prof. Guthrie conducted an inspiring song service. The special music was by a quartet, Messrs. Guthrie, Ralston, Littler and Hammer.

Then Dr. Riley made the devil an issue, without sensation, but with a force and earnestness that were impressive and convincing.

Nothing pleases the devil so much as a denial of him. There is no picture of Satan in the Bible, but the language is plain in reference to his personality. Sin renders hideous those governed by it, and therefore the devil must be a creature of horrible appearance.

The devil fell from a high estate. God made him right and he rebelled and fell. The Bible names are all personal ones. He has been getting worse, more hardened, rebellious and devilish. Sin is in the world and there has to be a personal devil.

In connection with it the speaker paid two respects to the modern philosophy. "All is God and God is good," a slander on God, when the crimes of the world are reviewed.

How can there be evil without a devil. If you don't need a physician because of no disease then you don't need judges because of no sin. Incidents of struggles against the wiles of the devil were given with graphic power.

A number asked for prayers. This afternoon Dr. Riley speaks on the Supreme Gift of the Spirit and tonight the subject will be the Devil in the Modern Drama.
