PROCLAMATION BY THE MAYOR.

Whereas, There was submitted to the qualified legal voters of the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, at the regular City Election held on Monday, the 4th day of December, in A. D. 1911, for their approval or rejection an amendment to the City Charter of said City as proposed by Resolution No. 33, adopted by the Common Council of said City, on the 27th day of September, 1911, which said proposed amendment is as foilows—

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF
