RAISING A BABY ELEPHANT

"When born he weighed 180 pounds, was 26 inches long, 3 feet long, and his trunk measured 10 inches. He is the only elephant ever bred and born in this country, which really presents one of the most remarkable cases known to naturalists.

"Baby Hutch, for that's his name, will be exhibited when our circus arrives here on Tuesday, May 28, both in the menagerie and during the regular performances."

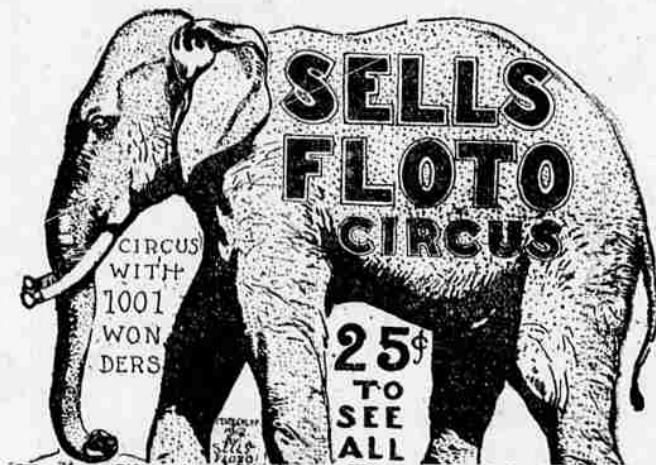
